We had some successes and some disappointments in our submissions to Auckland Council/Auckland Transport/Watercare. However, we are grateful that we, so often, have Local Board members attend our meetings and supporting our Community!

- Cleared trees from back boundary

- Painted extension
- Established a garden
- Fitted folding doors to stage
- Fitted side doors to sage and hallway

- Fitted new flexi door to main hall
- Installed Air Conditioning to main hall
- Installed suspended ceiling
- Working be to clean up back yard
- Worked with Greenhithe Community Trust on establishment of a Toy Library on our site
- Painted the Old School Building
- Equipped Hall with crockery/glassware

# ☆ Community Hall – A bold decision:

Early in 2020 we were approached by our neighbor at the rear with an offer to purchase a strip of land to enable him to maximize the value of his property by building two dwellings. The first offer was refused. After a number of months, we were approached a second time and the committee determined that the correct course of action was to get a registered valuation, which they did. The neighbor accepted our terms and has agreed to purchase 122 sq/m for \$138,000 plus all costs of subdividing, new titles and fencing.

The new boundary plan is attached to this report. The Committee considered this matter at length, not always agreeing with each other. However, once we had a true valuation and had recognized that the land involved had never been used in the 106 years since it was gifted by Captain Cotton (when the population of Greenhithe was 70 persons), the decision was not hard to make. This was seen as a one-time opportunity to benefit the community with improvements to its facilities and for the Association to operate with some funds in reserve, perhaps for the first time ever! This being even more important as the Association has exhausted every known source of funding over the last couple of years and still has pressing needs for maintenance and up-grading of facilities.

#### ☆ Community Hall – proposed Improvements:

- Overlay the Community hall floor (\$36k)
- Touch-up Exterior paint
- Touch-up Interior paint
- Replace chairs & tables
- Re-roof the Old School Building (\$22k)
- Re-seal windows at OSB
- Replace pipework at OSB
- Install Wifi at Community Hall
- Recarpet foyer of Community Hall
- Replace Road Sign at Community Hall

Much to be done in the next 12 months, but now all achievable!

## ☆ Community Infrastructure - Council/AT/Watercare:

Congratulations to Council and the Local Board on the superb new children's playground at Corner of Huntington and Kyle Road.

Thank-you to Local Board and Auckland Transport for taking our extensive report on broken, poorly maintained and dangerous footpaths seriously and starting what appears to be an extensive restoration program on Greenhithe's footpaths, beyond our expectations.

Our disappointment has been the postponing of works proposed for Rame Road due to Covid financial pressures. This is understanding under the circumstances, however neither the Residents Association nor your Local Board will allow this priority project to be forgotten.

Watercare disrupted Greenhithe for essential infrastructure work but, between them and AT, with pressure from GRA, they left us with better roads than we started with for which we are grateful.
